

In addition, a vote to approve the expenditure of an amount, not to exceed \$450,000, for the final design of the Center for Christian Education and its integration to the existing Concordia Center facilities, was approved with a 89% "yes" vote. A vote to call Rev. Ken Krueger as Pastoral Assistant for Worship, was approved with a 97% "yes" vote.
