MINISTRY MILESTONES

This year finds a number of area ministries marking special anniversary milestones. The 809 will feature one of these ministries in each of the upcoming issues. At the top of the list is our own congregation, Concordia Lutheran Church, which was established in 1874 and turns 145 years old this April. The following is from a brief history as found on the St. Louis Genealogy website:

The initial frame church on West Madison Street in Kirkwood, just east of Kirkwood Road, was built by Peter Bopp Sr. and some of his sons who were among the church's first members. The small church adopted the long name of Concordia Evangelical Lutheran Church of the Unaltered Augsburg Confession. In 1885 it became part of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. Concordia purchased a new site at Taylor Avenue and East Clinton Place in 1907 and completed a new building soon thereafter. In 1945 the congregation purchased the present location and construction began. The new church and school opened in 1947. Both old sites were sold and razed in 1979.
