After that process, the project will be put before the Council and the Congregation to seek approval to move forward. Next, Pastor Seidler provided his report, and the Council discussed the new worship schedule and touched on the ongoing strategic plan. In addition, the Council discussed the departure of Audrey Duensing-Werner, the staff's plans to fill the void created by her departure, and how the Church might address filling her position in the future.

November Inbound offerings missed budgeted expectations by \$22,000. Our offerings are \$97,000 less than our budgeted expectations and \$39,000 less than what they were at this same time last year. Staff is trying very hard to decrease expenses, but we ask that you prayerfully consider an increase in your inbound offerings.

I am excited about the opportunity to lead the Children's Ministry at Concordia. With every loss there is a new beginning. In the next season of ministry, our vision for KidsMin at Concordia involves spiritual formation and faith filled relationships. To that end, our goals are:

- 1. Every child develops a personal relationship with Jesus. The majority of people come to Christ as children. Growing a relationship with Christ involves building a foundation of Biblical knowledge, prayer, and service to others.
- 2. Every child encounters a faith-filled youth or adult that loves and nurtures them in their faith.

Everything we do will support that vision. KidsNight and our new Sunday KidsMin were formed around those principles. Speaking of Sunday, KidsMin...

KIDSMIN SUNDAY-NOVEMBER 5

For all kids 3 years old through 5th grade! Let's praise God! Let's learn the Bible in ways that are memorable and fun! Whether your family worships at 8:30am, 9:30am or 10:30am, KidsMin Sunday will work for you.

- 9:20-9:40am ALL kids check in outside the Dining Hall, on the parking lot side of the building (before 9:30am worship or after the 8:30am service concludes)
- 9:30-9:50am Let's Praise GOD! All age groups are welcomed and encouraged to praise God, together, through fun worship songs and faith-filled activities.
- 9:50-10:10am Let's Learn the Bible Point! Kids separate into age-specific groups to reinforce the Bible Point through age-appropriate activities.
- 10:15am For those parents in 9:30am worship, kids will be brought to the Concordia Center to join their families at the altar for Communion. All others will return to the Dining Hall for prayer and closing, pick up at 10:20am.

Parents of 2's

2-year-olds and their parents will learn basic Bible stories and songs led by Karen and David Lanius. You will also have the opportunity to break away with Karen and learn on how to share faith with your toddler. Parents must be present for a 2-year-old to attend. This class meets in the preschool hallway in the 2nd room on the right.

Children with special needs who require assistance are invited to attend on November 5 with a parent. Special Needs Ministry services will begin **Sunday, November 12.**

WHY SUNDAY KIDSMIN AT 9:30? THAT IS OUR MOST POPULAR SERVICE!

To the Family with Crazy Schedule ...

Your family is most likely much busier today than you were growing up. Your children have many more extra-curricular options that require significant time commitments (even on Sunday mornings). As a result, the frequency of your church attendance and family devotion time may be less than you wish it was. Did you know that national statistics define **REGULAR** worshipers as those who worship 1-2 times per month? That is a direct result of our busy culture. For many of our young children, the reality is their spiritual development happens in the one or two children's messages they hear each month. That is about 4-8 minutes per month!

Parents with young children often tell us they have not heard a sermon in years as they try to corral young children and keep them quiet. Many of you indicated on our worship survey this Summer that you would love a 9:30 KidsMin option. This is an opportunity to take this time and experience our core value to BE STILL and worship. Fill yourself up with God's Word so you can in turn fill up your children. We hope you find this a blessing. That being said, we do greatly value children in worship. We value that! This schedule enables you to worship at 8:30 or 10:30am and still have your children experience a deeper dive into Scripture at 9:30am without long delays or overlaps in worship times.

To the Parents who value worshiping with their children but also need a period of personal worship as well ... KidsMin gives no special stars for attendance. We encourage you to make different decisions each week - sometimes take your kids to worship and sometimes send them to KidsMin. Experience the best of both worlds. All services will still have a Children's Message.

At Concordia, we will not tell you how to raise your child or the best way to structure your Sunday morning. What we will do is partner with you to provide you with options knowing you will make the best decision for your family's circumstances and faith development.

As a church we take very seriously the opportunities we offer for children to learn to love Jesus and know and understand His Word. That is why we believe strongly in this new Sunday KidsMin schedule. Kids will praise God and learn a Bible point each week directly related to a Bible story. Your children will build Christ-filled relationships with other adults and youth. Our goal is for each child to build a solid foundation of Biblical knowledge and experience strong, lasting faith-filled relationships with others.
