Dear Friends in Christ,

One of the distinct JOYs of serving Concordia as a pastor is my almost-monthly New Member Orientation (NMO), which serves as the entree into Concordia for everyone who wishes to become a part of our faith family. From that class, participants move on to "Lutheran Introduction" if they are coming to us from other faith traditions or

if they are coming to Concordia as people new to the faith. Some are coming from other Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS) churches; for them, we try to find connections to life here at Concordia. If needed, we schedule baptisms and, in some cases, become part of a couple's journey towards marriage.

Part of the JOY for me as the instructor, however, is the instruction I receive from the participants in return. I learn how their own homes and families played a part in their faith development ... or not. Together, with Marcy Scholl and Sharon Karleskint, we get to resource these new friends and help make connections to the various ministries and groups of Concordia.

At our last NMO, we had couples connected because of Christ Community Lutheran School (CCLS), couples connecting because they were looking for a place to worship as one. We also had singles, one even accompanied by her grandma's cousin (an older adult willing to befriend) whom she had not met until that very night. Plus, a newly baptized young lady and the young man who was instrumental in guiding her to baptism also attended.

The JOY of a story: We also had among us a single mom who, up until this Summer, had pretty much given up on "religion." But ... that all changed because this congregation, volunteers of all ages, held a Vacation Bible School (VBS). Her kids came (even though she was very wary). Her kids liked VBS. Her kids wanted more. She attended the New Member Orientation. SHE HADN'T EVEN WORSHIPPED WITH US YET. And, she will be joining Marcy Scholl's Tuesday-night women's community group as her next step in worshipping with us.

Did you see what you did there? Do you see what you are doing here? With one another, working together, we are reaching others so that they might know Jesus. That is JOY!

THROUGH THE CHURCH THE SONG GOES ON

Faith sings. So raising our voices is something Christians do. It is hard to imagine a Christian church that doesn't sing. Frankly, I'm not sure it is even possible. The Lord has given us a "song to sing" (Psalm 40:3), and we sing it for one another and for the world. For each other, we "teach and admonish one another in all wisdom" as the Word "dwells in us richly" through psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs. (Colossians 3:16) This becomes a witness to our children as, through our singing, we "tell the generation the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord." (Psalm 78:4) Moreover, it is a witness to the world—an increasingly radical witness as we live among people who sing less and less. Those who don't really know Jesus have little reason to sing, but we who know the joy of the Gospel cannot keep from singing. This is beautifully confessed in the third stanza of the hymn, **Holy God, We Praise Thy Name**:



Lo, the Apostles' holy train join Thy sacred name to hallow; Prophets swell the glad refrain, and the white-robed martyrs follow, And from morn to set of sun through the Church the song goes on.

In the Divine Service, our song is joined with our fellow Christians throughout the world and throughout history. A fine voice is not required—just a heart for worship! No matter what service you normally attend, we invite you to grow in discipleship through the art of singing by joining our Sanctuary Choir. You will be blessed, and be a blessing to others. EXECUTIVE REPORT

OUR NEXT STEP UPDATE

We have a hole! We are very excited that digging has begun! Even though excavation started a little later than we had hoped, due to MSD approval, we believe we are still on track. I will keep you updated as things progress.

PARKING

Thank you for your patience with the parking situation. Also note a new sewer will be put in just outside Concordia's main lobby doors, so soon we will begin to access the building from the door just left of the Lobby. It will be clearly marked. This inconvenience should only last a few months; once the sewer is in place and the new parking lot is completed, access will become easier. The target for that is November.



OUR NEXT STEP FINANCING

The collection of pledges is going well. Right now, I am comfortable that the loan the congregation approved will be more than adequate to cover our building expenses. We have a good contingency in place AND pledges are coming in as expected. We recently sent out statements to those families with outstanding pledges, so they know where they stand. As a reminder, we ask that all Our Next Step pledges be fulfilled by 12/31/2019. That being said, the faster pledges are fulfilled, the fewer short-term loans we need (see the \$85,000 estimate for loan interest below). Currently, we still have \$2.3 million in the bank for Our Next Step, but as we ramp up construction, these funds will get spent quickly.

INBOUND FINANCIALS

Both Offerings and Expenses overall in 2018 are doing well. Offerings are slightly ahead of expectations and expenses are lower than budgeted, except in the area of facilities. Our HVAC costs skyrocketed this year due to multiple major system issues. Our expense savings have offset this, however, and I do not see this as a long-term issue.

CONFIRMATION

Concordia recognizes that Confirmation is a significant spiritual event, but that it is also a process. Through instruction and faith mentoring, we hope that youth learn about the Christian faith, continue to experience what it means to be a member of the body of Christ, and are encouraged to consider how they intend to live out their lives as Christians. The process culminates with the confirmand making a public confession of their faith through their Confirmation vows.

Our Confirmation process is the core activity of our Jr. High Youth Ministry. Through a three-year process, our youth and their families express a commitment to growing in their faith (6th grade, 7th grade and 8th grade, with the Rite of Confirmation in October of their 9th grade year). The goal is really twofold: head knowledge and heart application. It is expected that, during these three years of commitment, a student will trust in Christ as his/her Lord and Savior. Confirmation at Concordia is an interactive, hands-on and learning-based model.

Confirmation/Jr. High Ministry takes place on **Wednesday nights** through the school year, **beginning September 12**. We gather at **5:45pm** and conclude at 7:30pm. The Bible Fellowship for Adults with Special Needs began at Concordia almost too easily. This is all due to the tireless efforts of Jerry Witte. For more than a decade, each and every week, Jerry traveled between three Bethesda group homes in South County teaching the Word of God to the adults with special needs who lived there. I leapt at the chance to move this group into our building!

Our class begins with refreshments and conversation as everyone catches up. This is then followed by Biblical instruction delivered in a way that is accessible to

these adults with special learning needs. We conclude each week with a craft, recipe or service project related to the lesson. We have a lot of fun!

Our class is growing, slowing but surely. Group homes from St. Charles now join us, in addition to some new friends we have met along the way, sometimes at the invitation of our adult learners themselves!

EPIC AND IMPACT MISSION WEEKS

(4th-5th grade) and IMPACT (6th-8th grade) Mission Initiatives took our kids outside their "comfort/familiarity" zones—packing backpacks for under-resourced kids, sorting donated clothing, labeling food to be shared with the needy, and cleaning/ sprucing up the play area at the Peace Center. This significant learning experience taught our Youth Ministry how accessible and receptive these partners are for short bursts of involvement to help other volunteers in their work!






VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL (VBS)

VBS. They were surrounded with love and with fun. Bible stories, games, snacks, songs, gifts, prizes, crafts, and sports jam-packed every moment. I asked several kids what they liked best, and the response was often a glazed and



One of the crew leaders that helped make this adventure easier was a CFNA scholarship student that graduated from LHSS with honors. She is now a student at SLU and an eager volunteer in CFNA programs. She first came to Concordia as a 6-year-old to attend The Jerusalem Market Place with her family. This family from Nepal was newly arrived, wide-
