tended the Gathering, and I've been blessed to attend four times with Concordia youth. I've learned firsthand why this opportunity is important for your child. It's a "once-in-a-lifetime" experience because it only happens every three years, so for most senior high youth, they have one chance to go.



The Gathering trip isn't just about the five-day event we will be attending, although it is amazing. It's more about building relationships with other senior high youth and adults at Concordia. It's also about nurturing your faith life and keeping you connected to your church. All youth who are attending will be part of a "community group" made up of 5-7 youth and an adult leader. You will develop closer relationships with your community group members, through social, spiritual and fundraising events in the year leading up to the Gathering.
