
The Center for Christian Education Opens!


It is with great joy that we celebrate the opening of the Center for Christian Education (CCE)! Please join us **Sunday, April 11 from 4:00-6:00pm** in the Center for an open house. We will offer tours to explain the design and how both the church and school will use the Center. In the Dining Commons, enjoy refreshments (both for children and adults) and live music. What a great day to celebrate! Then, on **Sunday, August 17-18**, we will dedicate the Center in all worship services. We hope you can join us for both joyous occasions.

How will we use the Center?

The Center for Christian Education will house ALL Youth and Children's ministry beginning August 18th. All current ministries will move to the new building and we have plans for several future ones as well.









CURRENT MINISTRIES STARTING AUGUST/SEPTEMBER

Christ Community Lutheran School – Middle School Grades – 5-8

The building was designed to adapt to the new ways kids learn today with flexible spaces and seating for large group, small group and individual study based on best-practice research.

Christ Community Lutheran School Early Childhood – Infant through Pre-Kindergarten

The Center for Christian Education) CCE provides an expanded Early Childhood program to include two infant rooms, an additional 1 year old room, and new indoor and outdoor play areas.

Wednesday Night Confirmation – Grades 6-8

The large Commons in the upper level of the CCE more than doubles the current youth room size, better accommodating our Wednesday night program with 60-80 kids each week. In addition, the Center provides better rooms for Wednesday dinners and small group settings.

Wednesday KidsNight - Grades 1-5th

The new Dining Commons, kitchen and classrooms are nicer and better located together than the current facility with much closer proximity to the gym for recreation.

Sunday Nursery

With the expanded Early Childhood classrooms, we have many options for the new Nursery. The existing Nursery will become a Special Needs classroom (more on that later from Jessica Crawford). Although the new Nursery will be a little further away from the worship centers, we believe it is a better, safer solution for our children and babies. According to fire code, children that cannot yet walk should never be cared for in a group setting not on ground level. Now that one is available, the fire department will insist on us relocating. In case of an emergency, if you need to evacuate several children at once, it is imperative they have easy access to exits.

Sunday Morning KidsMin - Ages 3 - 5th grade

The large Commons provides a warmer, better space for the large group portion on Sunday. The close proximity of the classrooms will better accommodate the grade-level teaching, and, the CCE is closer to the Concordia Center for kids who return for Communion or parent pickup.

NEW Sunday Morning Senior Youth Fellowship

Beginning August 18th, the Small Commons, just outside the Concordia center, will be a new Senior Youth fellowship area where they can eat donuts and hang out (without parents).

Evening Bible Studies

Any and all adult evening Bible studies are welcome and encouraged to use the CCE.

All other Senior or Junior Youth and Children's ministry

As new programs and schedules are announced they will be planned in the CCE so stay tuned! As we move in and get settled no doubt we will find many other ways to use the CCE. We are so excited for you to see the space. See you on the 11th and 18th!

Earlier in July, I had the honor and privilege of getting to know over 90 youth and adults from Concordia during the LCMS Youth Gathering. While there were countless memories created throughout the trip, the most impactful for me was seeing the youth build deep connections with one another and with their adult leaders. It was heartwarming to hear the deep conversations and openness from the youth throughout the trip.

This closeness and impact the small groups had on the youth's faith development inspired me to create a plan for the youth ministry going forward. I am so excited to share that this fall, we will be introducing a small group program. At Concordia, we love paintball, pie-eating contests, and lock-ins, and although we will continue to do those events, the youth need a more meaningful experience. High schoolers have real

and present questions about their faith and lives, questions that can only be asked and answered in a close, inviting, and supportive small group setting. It is my hope that these small groups become like family and foster an environment where youth can be themselves and not hesitate to ask questions about faith and life in general.

Here's how the program will work. Small groups will be led by an exceptional adult leader who has a passion for helping youth grow closer to God. Youth will get the opportunity to choose their top preferences for the adult leader that they feel most comfortable with or would like to build a deeper relationship with. We will then create groups based on that and announce them when the program officially begins on Wednesday, September 11 (more details to come). Small groups will meet once a month to grow close, deepen their faith, and of course have fun.

On **Sunday, August 4**, from 10:45am-1:00pm, we will have a kick-off event to introduce the small group program to the youth. The youth can hang out, meet others, and spend time with the adults who have volunteered to be leaders in this program. Lunch will be provided and we will have fun activities for all of the youth to participate in.

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
