Once upon a time, hospitals and churches used to work together. Let's say you were going to be hospitalized. As part of the registration for your stay, hospitals would ask you for your church affiliation and contact information. Once they had that information, the hospital would call your church to let them know that you were admitted. This knowledge would enable your pastor to make a "hospital call". He would come and share Scripture, have prayer and perhaps even bring you the sacrament of Holy Communion.

That was "once upon a time." It doesn't happen anymore due to certain regulations the hospitals have to follow. Which leaves your pastoral care team at a disadvantage... UNLESS you call and let us know of a hospitalization. With that knowledge, our team will be able to serve you.

Our team is led by Sharon Ema, Director of the Healing Arts. Through many and various means like texts, emails, phone calls and often Sharon Karleskint, she is made aware of the healing needs of our members. Utilizing primarily myself, Pastor Schultz, and Pastor Eric Erkkinen, she assigns us our caring visits to members in need. Sharon makes many of these visits as well. She also directs an awesome crew of communion visitors who regularly visit some of our members who are homebound.

We wanted you to know that you have a team that is ready to care for you. It's a Be One and a Be Faithful kind of thing.





Thank you for your continued dedication to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Your tireless and sacrificial actions do not go unnoticed. Your hard work this season of ministry reminds me of what the writer of the book of Hebrews says: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us." At Concordia, we are surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses—thousands of members who have entrusted their spiritual care to this church and daily show what it means to be a Christian to everyone they meet. While everyone's race is a little bit different, we are all surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses who confess the saving name of Jesus wherever they go. Thank you and keep up the good work.

One area I would like to highlight for this season of ministry is our confirmation program. On Wednesday nights, Concordia has the privilege and potential to educate over 100 students in the Christian faith. This is not something we take lightly or for granted. This confirmation discipleship program is bearing fruit because of the cloud of witnesses our students see in our congregation who embody the Christian faith. And in the years to come, these students will continue to be witnesses to younger generations who are not yet born.

Confirmation at Concordia is a three-and-a-quarter year journey, beginning in sixth grade and ending in ninth grade with the rite of confirmation in the Fall. This journey is marked by learning skills, attitudes, and knowledge about God using the Bible and the Small Catechism. Throughout this journey, the students will grow in who they are as they will in turn one day grow others.

Continue to pray for all the education opportunities at Concordia, but specifically for this confirmation program. Pray that God's will would be done as this tool is used to communicate the saving message of Jesus and His will for these student's lives. Pray that all these students would grow and lead happy and peaceful lives of service wherever they are lead. Thank you for your partnership in this program. Your support and prayers are appreciated. May God continue to bless this great cloud of witnesses.

Additionally, since we now have multiple common spaces in the CCE for the youth to utilize, the previous youth room will now be called the Community Lounge.





INBOUND OFFERINGS DOWN SIGNIFICANTLY OVER 2018

After several months of missing our Inbound Offerings budget, we hoped the end of summer and strong fall ministry kick-offs would lead to a turn-around. In reality, September seemed to slip even more. Our general offerings are down significantly over 2018. Through the end of September, Inbound Offerings were \$158,000 lower (10%) than 2018. The chart to the right shows how after Easter, the disparity between 2018 and 2019 grew almost every month.

In the beginning of October, we will send out Contribution Statements for the first three quarters of 2019 (thru (9/30/19). Please prayerfully consider helping our ministry as you are able.

Concordia offers many ways to donate to our ministry. Our members use cash, check, credit cards and bank account transfers to donate.

Primary Ways to Give:

Offering Envelope: Give cash or check and put in offering basket during worship

Online at CKhome.org. Click on Giving in the upper right corner. You can select to give one time or make your gift recurring.

NOTE: Credit card companies charge us 3%. Bank accounts are very low cost for us, so we encourage you to set up online donations using your bank account versus credit card. (However, please use what is best for your family)

Tax Saving Ways to Give

Donate Stock: Did you know if you donate appreciated stock, you will have no capital gains tax to pay. This is a great way to maximize your gifts to our ministry and save you money at the same time. Donate from Your IRA: If over 70 ½ years old, you may donate your Required Minimum Distribution from your IRA directly to Concordia. When you do this, you will avoid paying income taxes on the amount you donate.

As we wrap up our Be Still, Be One, Be Faithful series of messages, we'll have a few weeks of special services in the month of October: Witness Weekend, Reformation and Confirmation, and All Saints Day.

The weekend of October 19 and 20 is known as Witness Weekend. Throughout all of the services, our 9th-grade confirmands will share their personal faith statements with the whole congregation. It's an inspiring opportunity to hear these young people give testimony to their faith.

On the weekend of **October 26 and 27**, we celebrate Reformation and Confirmation. Reformation weekend recalls our Christian foundation, rooted in three principles: Faith

Alone, Grace Alone, and Scripture Alone. The Confirmation service will be held in the Concordia Center at **11:00am**. Please note that this is 15 minutes later than our normal service time.

Looking ahead to early November, we celebrate All Saints Day on **November 2 and 3**. During our worship, we'll take a moment to reflect on and remember those in our congregation or other family and friends who have entered into eternal life this past year. While there is certainly solemnity to the remembrance, it's also a chance to remember and give thanks for the lives of these saints. Please look for an announcement about submitting any names of family or friends who were not members of Concordia. We will be happy to include them in our remembrance.
